



PTSA 2024-2025 Scholarship Application Community College, Technical or Trade School

The PTSA is pleased to offer scholarships up to \$500 to outstanding seniors who are **Newsome High School PTSA members** by March 5, 2025. Scholarships are available to selected Newsome graduates pursuing a postsecondary education. Scholarship winners will be announced at Awards Night in April 2025.

An independent Scholarship Committee comprised of judges, who have no affiliation with Newsome High School, will base their decisions on the following criteria: Newsome Activities and Leadership, Academics, Community Service/Work Activities, Essay, Activities outside of Newsome and ONE Letter of Recommendation. The Scholarship Committee is looking for the well-rounded individual that represents Newsome High School.

Newsome High School PTSA Scholarship requirements:

- Good Citizenship at Newsome as demonstrated by no OSS or ISS suspensions
- Must be a 2025 graduating Newsome High School student in good standing
- Must be a **student** member of the PTSA
- Satisfactory scholastic record with a minimum GPA 3.0 (unweighted)
- Plan to attend an accredited university, or college full time (12 hours minimum).
- Included One Letter of Recommendation (No relatives) with the application
- Include an Essay (500 words or less) with the application
- Include a Resume which details high school activities, achievements, community service and work experience with the application
- Include a Student Summary from Newsome guidance with the application

Please note the following:

- Do not include pictures or personal identifiers on your scholarship application. ***All names and addresses will be redacted in the application and student summary as judges will only know your application by the number assigned to it.***
- You can only apply for ONE scholarship (either the 4-year college or the community college, trade or technical school)

Application must be completed and turned in by **3:30 pm on WEDNESDAY, March 5, 2025** to the Guidance Office. Late applications will not be accepted.
